

Privacy Policy

This privacy policy tells you how we use and disclose information collected at this site from, or otherwise received by us from, persons who are not our clients. If any law or regulation requires us to provide a greater level of protection for the information than is described by this policy, we will provide that greater level of protection.

This privacy policy is part of our Terms of Use for this website. By accepting our Terms of Use, you accept and agree to the practices described in this Privacy Policy. Certain words used in this privacy policy are defined in the Terms of Use.

1. Scope of this Policy

This privacy policy applies to information that we receive from a visitor who is not a prospective client or an actual client of our firm.

A prospective client is someone with whom we discuss the possibility of forming an attorney-client relationship. Unilaterally communicating with us does not make you a prospective client.

A client is someone we have agreed to represent and with whom an attorney-client relationship has been formed.

In contrast to the information to which this privacy policy applies, information that we receive from a prospective client or actual client of our firm is entitled to protection under the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct. In compliance with those rules, we keep confidential information relating to our discussion with the prospective client or to our representation of the client, unless the prospective client or client gives informed consent to disclosure or unless disclosure is permitted or required by the rules. Information that we receive from a client may also be protected by the attorney-client privilege, which allows a client to refuse to disclose to an adverse party certain conversations with, and certain advice provided to the client by, the client's attorney.

2. What Information We Collect.

When you use this website, we do not collect personally identifying information (such as name, address, phone number, email address, etc.) about you unless you voluntarily provide it to us by contacting us. We may also collect other information from you if you voluntarily provide it to us.

Cookies and Tracking: This website may use cookie and tracking technology depending on the features offered. Cookie and tracking technology are used to gather information such the type of browser and operating system a visitor uses to access this website, tracking the number of visitors to this website, and understanding how visitors use this website. Personal information is not collected via this cookie and other tracking technology. If you wish to disable cookies, refer to your browser's help menu to learn how to disable cookies. 3. How We Use the Information We Collect.

The information that we collect as described in Paragraph 2 is not confidential, is not protected by the attorney-client privilege and may be used or disclosed by us for any purpose.

Examples of how we may use your information include, among other things:

- (a) to communicate with you regarding a request or inquiry that you have made;
- (b) to respond to your request or inquiry by providing you with information about our law firm, our legal services or other information;
- (c) to determine whether to discuss with you the possibility of forming an attorney-client relationship; and
- (d) to improve this website, the services we offer, or our marketing.

Examples of how we may disclose your information may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (a) We may share your information as may be reasonably necessary with third parties who provide services to us or who provide services on our behalf. Examples include, but are not limited to, our independent contractors who assist us in administering this website.

We may use information that you provide to us to assert a claim against you on behalf of a client or to defend a claim you make against a client. **For this reason, you should be careful not to provide us with any information that you consider to be confidential or sensitive, unless and until we agree to serve as your attorneys.**

We are a law firm that collects debts on behalf of our clients and any information obtained in response to those efforts will be used for that purpose.
